We finished the 2023 membership year with 30,020 members, a gain of nearly 1,200 over the previous year. We were also excited for the return of an in-person Day on the Hill, with over 130 members from every corner of the state coming together to meet with elected officials and other leaders to share their personal stories. Individually our members shone, demonstrating the great leaders Farm Bureau helps to develop, both within the organization and in their everyday lives. Through Young Farmer & Rancher competitions, regional leadership programs
